Choose one of these homework activities each week

GPS

Look out for **contractions** in your reading book
e.g. I'm = I am, we're = we are, she's = she's
Be careful that you don't get confused with
apostrophes for possession e.g. the boy's jumper
as this is not a contraction.

Science

Can you go on a 'States of the Matter' hunt?
What solids, liquids and gases can you find in
the world around you? You can draw pictures or
take photographs. Don't forget to organise your
findings like a good Scientist!

Art

Go and visit one of the Folkestone Artworks.
Create a page in your homework book describing
the art. Comment on the formal elements (line,
tone, colour, pattern, texture and shape).

Computing

What is the internet made of? Research and find
out! Record your findings.

PSHE

Write a recipe for what makes a good friend e.g. a
handful of kindness, a generous spoon of
humour.
